

Citizen Science

Citizen science projects offer the opportunity to become involved in monitoring our local environment. Several projects that you might like to consider joining, either one-off or on a regular basis, include the sea slug census, the Friends of the Bluff Bioblitz and Parks Victoria's

marine Rapid Health Assessment program.

Sea slug census

Parks Victoria will be leading a sea slug census on the shores of the *Barwon Bluff Marine Sanctuary on Monday 30 June from 9 am.* They also have one planned for The Point Lonsdale Marine Reserve on Tuesday 1st July, similar time. You will need to register on <u>Parks Connect</u> to participate.



FOB Bioblitz

We run regular bioblitzes of the Barwon Heads Marine Sanctuary and upload the search results to inaturalist. The aim is to build a picture of biodiversity within and around the sanctuary over time. You don't have to be an expert - all you need is a camera (the one on your phone, for example), the ability to negotiate rocky terrain and a curious mind. Winter can be a tricky time to

find suitable tides that coincide with daylight and kind weather conditions, though. A tentative date for our next one is *Wed 23rd July at 9am* - to be confirmed closer to the day

Rapid Health Assessment of marine ecosystems

Friends of the Bluff are keen to trial community engagement in the Parks Victoria Rapid Health Assessment program. Monique Bregman from PV will tell us about the program during a session at the BCDC on Tuesday 1st July from 430 pm to 6.00 pm. She will then run through the methodology with us on the shore the following morning. There will be further sessions if we have enough interest from you all. So, please let us know 1) whether you can attend the first introductory sessions and 2) whether you are interested in participating in the RHA program, but are unable to attend the initial sessions.

Nature Festival

The 2025 Barwon Heads Nature Festival will be held during the first week of September school holidays (AFL grand final week): Mon 22 - Fri 26 September. We have a draft program and are now looking for interested members to assist with delivering this popular event.
