Holly captivated the audience with stunning underwater photography and stories from her snorkeling adventures.



There were numerous volunteer-led workshops and field sessions out on the Bluff over the two days, including a sea slug census. Despite wet and windy weather, spirits stayed high – especially when colourful sea slugs were found! One of the most memorable parts of the weekend was the sense of community it created. Between workshops and over delicious meals prepared by Feed Me Surf Coast, people who arrived as strangers quickly became friends, bonding over stories, laughter, and a shared passion for protecting Victoria's marine environments.

The event was supported by Coastcare Victoria, Barwon Coast, and Parks Victoria, with Alison Marchant MP, Member for Bellarine, attending to welcome visitors and acknowledge the vital role of volunteers in caring for marine environments. Local artists Deb Fisher, Martin Bigmore, and Cassy Twomey also generously donated artwork for a raffle, leaving some participants with lifelong memories of the weekend.

Sharing the Love began as a simple conversation in 2010 between a few people who shared a deep love for Victoria's coast has since grown into a statewide tradition.
